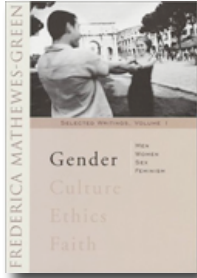


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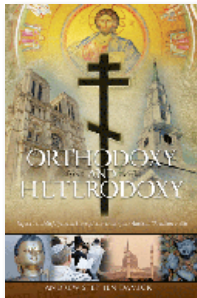


Gender: Men, Women, Sex and Feminism

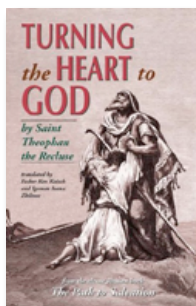

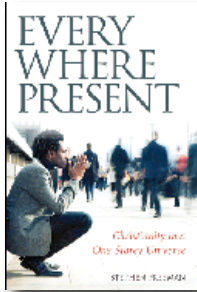
Turning the Heart to God

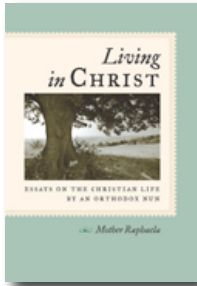
